Course Title: Constitutional Law for Justice Personnel

Course Description: Surveys the basic guarantees of liberty described in the U.S. Constitution and the historical development of these restrictions on government power, primarily through U.S. Supreme Court decisions. Reviews rights of free speech, press, and assembly, as well as criminal procedure guarantees (to counsel, jury trial, habeas corpus, etc.) as they apply to the activities of those in the criminal justice system. Lecture 3 hours per week.

- a. Describe and discuss basic guarantees of liberty described in the U.S. Constitution;
- b. Describe and discuss the amendments to the U. S. Constitution to include those items of particular interest to criminal justice;

- d. Describe and discuss rights guaranteed in the U.S. Constitution.

- a. History and general applications of constitutional provisions
- b. The Bill of Rights

- d. Impact on law enforcement as a result of Supreme Court decisions
