Course Prefix and Number: ASL 295 Credits: 3

Course Title: Sign Tuning

Course Description: Provides an opportunity to explore various language elements in ASL, including advanced and colloquial aspects of phonology, morphology, grammar/syntax, semantics, variation, and historical change. Prerequisite: ASL 295 – Topics in ASL: American Sign Language III. Co-requisites: ASL 125 and ASL 220. Lecture 3 hours per week.

General Course Purpose: The purpose of this class is to serve as a vehicle of transition for students from the old ASL curriculum to the new ASL, AAS program. This course (Sign Tuning) is to expand the ASL lexicon of these students, beginning ASL-English interpretation students, and to provide an opportunity for students to improve ASL fluency in order to effectively continue in the ASL-English Interpretation AAS curriculum.

Course Prerequisites and Co-requisites:

Prerequisite: ASL 295 - Topics in ASL: American Sign Language III

Co-requisites: ASL 125 and ASL 220

Course Objectives:
