- If male between 18-25 years old, you must be registered with Selective Service;

May not be an international student;

- Must have a high school diploma or GED;
- Actively enrolled for Spring 2020 term as of National Emergency Declaration (3/13/2020)
- Not in all online courses as of 3/13/2020
- Must meet satisfactory academic progress requirements;
- Must not have any drug convictions while enrolled in college, receiving federal financial aid; and
- Submitting an incomplete application.

Otherwise, students are able to submit the CARES Act Emergency Fund Application for consideration for eligibility.

Some reasons a student might be denied funds?

- Student does not meet basic eligibility requirements
- Student has a Pell Overpayment
- Student has reached or exceeded PELL LEU limitations

Otherwise, students are able to submit the CARES Act Emergency Fund Application

6. If I did not file a FAFSA yet can I still file one to receive grant funds? If yes, which aid year FAFSA do I need to complete?
