What is a drop? What is a withdrawal?

It's important to know the difference between dropping a course vs withdrawing from the course. It's all about timing!

If you decide you no longer want to be enrolled in a course prior to or on the last day to drop a course and receive a refund then you are dropping a course. For example, you have until January 26, 2021 to drop a course for any Regular session coursework this spring! If you decide you no longer want to be enrolled in a Regular session course on January 27th then you would be withdrawing from the course. So how are they different?

Drops

Essentially, dropping a course is acting like a course never happened in the first place. You would...

- be refunded for tuition and fees for the course
- not have the course appear on your academic transcript
- not have the course impact your SAP completion rate
- drop the course in your SIS!

Withdrawals

Withdrawing from a course will still be part of your student record. To withdraw means...

- you do not qualify for a tuition and fee refund for the course
- the course will appear on your academic transcript
- the course will negatively impact your SAP completion rate
- you would need to submit a withdrawal form as your financial aid may be impacted!
