Course Prefix and Number: ASL 210 Credits: 3

Course Title: ASL Storytelling

Course Description: Focuses on the elements of storytelling in American Sign Language and the techniques that deaf individuals utilize to pass on the histories and traditions of the deaf community. Emphasizes comprehension and production of short stories in American Sign Language with emphasis on sign production clarity and conceptual accuracy. Prerequisite: ASL 295 – Topics in ASL: American Sign Language IV or program head placement. Lecture 3 hours per week.

General Course Purpose: To expand the ability to produce extended narratives in ASL
