Course Prefix and Number: PNG 225 Credits: 3

Course Title: Patient-Centered Care III Clinical

Course Description: Provides students with the opportunity to implement classroom learning in structured health care settings. Focuses on using the nursing process to plan and implement safe, evidence-based, patient-centered care. Provides the student an opportunity to implement care coordination and manage resources to support patient care. Prerequisites: PNG 210 and PNG 215. Co-requisite: PNG 220. Laboratory 9 hours per week.

General Course Purpose: This course is required for the practical nursing student to demonstrate mastery of program concepts in the safe care of individuals across the lifespan.

Course Prerequisites and Co-requisites:

Prerequisites: PNG 210 and PNG 215

Co-requisite: PNG 220

Student Learning Outcomes:

Upon completing the course, the student will be able to

- a. Provide safe care in multiple settings with a variety of patients including those with cognitive and physical limits [Safety] (SLO 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5);
- b. Support desired health outcomes in patients while respecting dignity, diversity, and self-determination of patients and families [Quality] (SLO 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5);
- c. Collaborate with patients, families, and the interprofessional team to assist in planning, delivery, and coordination of patient-centered care to assigned patients [Team/Collaboration] (SLO 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5);
