Course Title: Central Sterile Infection Control

Course Description: Introduces the fundamentals of infection control. Content will include an introduction to concepts of microbiology including cell structure and theory, microbial function, human and pathogen relationships, infectious process, blood-borne and airborne pathogens, defense microorganisms, and principles of microbial control and destruction. Lecture 2 hours per week.

General Course Purpose: This course develops infection control knowledge and competency in the health care environment with a focus on the surgical microbial infection.
