Course Prefix and Number: HIM 226 Credits: 2

Course Title: Legal Aspects of Health Record Documentation

Course Description: Presents the legal requirements associated with health record documentation. Emphasizes the policies and procedures concerning the protection of the confidentiality of patient's health records. Lecture 2 hours per week.
