Course Title: The Second World War

Course Description: Examines causes and consequences of the Second World War. Includes the rise of totalitarianism, American neutrality, military developments, the home fronts, diplomacy, and the decision to use the atomic bomb. Prerequisite: Placement in ENG 111 or placement in Corequisites ENG 111 and EDE 11. Lecture 3 hours per week.
