Course Title: Introduction to Floral Design

Course Description: Teaches skills required for the composition of basic table arrangements. Includes the history of design styles, identification of flowers and greens, identification and use of equipment, and conditioning and handling of flowers. Lecture 2 hours. Laboratory 2 hours. Total 4 hours per week.

General Course Purpose: Introduces students to the design principles needed to create basic floral designs, and the identification of the materials used in the floral industry.
