MOVING FORWARD Pivoting PDO

This year, CETL **reestablished the** Faculty Advisory Committee.

CETL's goals for AY2026-2027 were created in collaboration with this committee as well as Faculty Senate to ensure we provide instructors with relevant, meaningful support.

ASYNCHRONOUS COURSES



- Courses that should take no longer than 2 hours to complete
- Fully asynchronous with knowledge checks and a capstone
- Final badge or certificate issued after demonstration of proficiency

COURSE-BASED APPROACH

- Focus on larger ideas and offer a longer semester-long course of 3-4 sessions
- Cohorts available, but limited (to maintain quality feedback)



IN-PERSON OFFERINGS



- Fewer, but more topical FLOs
- Increased focus on larger, highquality PDO events
- Addition of evening opportunities to better support adjunct needs
