ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

For Accounting

Between

J. Sargeant Reynolds Community College (JSRCC)

And

Mary Baldwin College (MBC)

For students planning to pursue Accounting at Mary Baldwin College.

<u>Purpose</u>: This memorandum of understanding has been developed within the framework of the Mary Baldwin College to facilitate the transfer of credits earned by students with Associate of Applied Science (A.A.S.) degrees in accounting at J. Sargeant Reynolds Community College into Bachelor of Art (B.A.) degree programs in Business at Mary Baldwin College. It is intended to provide students enrolled in the Associate of Applied Science - Accounting program at J. Sargeant Reynolds Community College admission into the baccalaureate business programs at Mary Baldwin College.

JSRCC will advertise this program to the general public within the JSRCC service area. The program will be promoted as the "Accounting Associate of Applied Science Transfer Degree Program" in the JSRCC catalog, website and other publicity material. Representatives of JSRCC and MBC will call attention to this articulation agreement when advising students.

Courses listed in this program will be reviewed, as needed, by the faculty of both institutions to ensure continuity of instruction, curriculum, and evaluation. The attached "Accounting Transfer Program Table" lists the respective transfer credits that will be awarded by MBC for courses offered by JSRCC students for transfer under the terms of the Agreement. This table will be updated as curricula evolve. There is a limit of 90 credits that may be transferred to MBC from JSRCC and course equivalency and transfer credits should be limited to those courses required for the student's selected major at MBC. General education requirements for MBC degree can be completed at Reynolds but requires course approval from MBC.

Mary Baldwin College guarantees admission into its B.A. program Business (concentration in Accounting) with junior standing to those students in the JSRCC Associate of Applied Science Accounting program and who have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.75 on a 4.0 scale and no individual grade lower than "C."

MBC will consider JSRCC students who have not completed the A.A.S. program for admission into its B.A. Business program (concentration in Accounting). However, the course equivalencies as stated in the Accounting Transfer Program Table are based on the completion of the Associate of Applied Science degree program prior to transfer. Course credit cannot be given for transfer courses in which the student earned below a "C" grade. Students who transfer prior to the completion of the associate degree program will have their courses evaluated individually per the MBC Transfer Guide. Therefore, students are encouraged to complete the Associate of Applied Science degree prior to matriculating to MBC.

Students can transfer credits back to JSRCC from MBC.

To apply for admission to MBC, students will complete a free online application. Applications are accepted year-round. Federal financial aid is available by filling out the FAFSA. Based on financial aid eligibility, the Virginia Tuition Assistance Grant and Two-Year College Transfer Grant Program are potential options. MBC offers one Phi Theta Kappa scholarship each year of \$1000. The application deadlines are August 15 for Fall, November 30 for Spring, and April 30 for Summer.
